This session highlights the Vermont Oxford Network's multicenter quality improvement collaborative to improve outcomes for infants with neonatal abstinence syndrome. Learn how 200 teams tested potentially better practices, achieved rapid-cycle adoption of key components of the American Academy of Pediatrics Guidelines for Neonatal Drug Withdrawal, and decreased length of pharmacologic treatment, length of stay, and associated hospital costs.

Discharge from a NICU stay can be exciting, yet scary and uncertain. Three parents are excited to share and discuss their stories, including what was and wasn't helpful at discharge. 


